
FALSE NAMES ON WATCHES.

Stated to be the first prosecution of its kind in Scotland, Charles L. Reis and Co., jewellers, were yesterday fined 63s., with 30s. expenses, at Glasgow, when they pleaded guilty to a charge at the instance of the London Chamber of Commerce of selling a watch to which was attached a false trade name.

It was stated that the Chamber of Commerce was determined to end this abuse. Cheap watches, mainly from abroad, had well-known names stamped on their faces in order to give the buying public the impression that they were buying watches of English firms of repute.
